Defeating the Adversary – Part 2
1 Peter 5:8, 9**

Big Idea – I need to be aware of the reality of my adversary the devil.

1 Peter 5:8 “Stay alert! Watch out for your adversary/enemy, the devil. He prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour.

9 Stand firm against him and be strong in your faith. Remember that your Christian brothers and sisters all over the world are going through the same kind of suffering you are.

(Review first 3 points from last week’s message)

Aka

anointed cherub (Ezekiel 28:14), Lucifer (Isaiah 14:12-14)

prince of this world (John 16:11)

prince of the power of the air (Ephesians 2:2)

god of this age (2 Corinthians 4:4)

great dragon, the devil, the accuser, Satan (Revelation 12:10)

1. Satan is the adversary of every believer in Jesus Christ.

2. What should my response be against this enemy? (Ephesians 6:10 – 13)

Be strong in the Lord’s mighty power. (Ephesians 6:10)

Put on the whole armor of God (Ephesians 6:11)

3. What does this allow me to accomplish?

Stand against the troops of the devil (Ephesians 6:12; Colossians 1:16)

Stand against the tricks of the devil (Ephesians 6:11)

4. What are the devil's major deceptions/tricks/tools used to defeat Christians?

Lies

John 8:44 “the devil ... was a murderer from the beginning, and does not tell the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of lies.”

First lie he told Eve in Genesis 3:4 “...you shall not die”

One of big lies he uses against believers today is, “You're all alone, you're on your own.

No one else knows or cares about what you're going through.

No one else has this trial, problem, sin. (1 Peter 5:9b) “Remember that your Christian brothers and sisters all over the world are going through the same kind of suffering you are.”

2 Corinthians 1:4 “He comforts us in all our troubles so that we can comfort others. When they are troubled, we will be able to give them the same comfort God has given us.

5 For the more we suffer for Christ, the more God will shower us with his comfort through Christ.

6 Even when we are weighed down with troubles, it is for your comfort and salvation! For when we ourselves are comforted, we will certainly comfort you. Then you can patiently endure the same things we suffer.”

Unbelief

Hebrews 3:12 Beware, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief in departing from the living God;

3:19 So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief.

Matthew 17:20 Jesus said to them, "Because of your unbelief; for assuredly, I say to you, if you have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you.

Croft M. Pentz, in his book, The Complete Book of Zingers gave these words about unbelief:

Unbelief is the door to hell.

A pessimist is someone who likes to listen to the patter of little defeats.

When you say, "I can't" you are saying, "God can't."

Doubt

Genesis 3:1 "Has God said..."

James 1:5-7 "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him.

6 But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. 7 For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord."

Doubt sees the obstacles--faith sees the way.

Charles Spurgeon said, "Believe me, the life of grace is not dead level; it is not a marsh country, a vast flat. There are mountains, and there are valleys. There are tribes of Christians who live in the lowlands -such dwellers in the lowlands of unbelief are forever doubting, fearing, troubled about their interest in Christ, and tossed to and fro; but there are other believers, who, by God's grace, have climbed the mountain of full assurance and near communion. Their place is with the eagle in his eyrie, high aloft; they are like the strong mountaineer who has trodden the virgin snow, who has breathed the fresh, free air of the Alpine regions, and therefore his sinews are braced, and his limbs are vigorous. These are they who do great exploits, being mighty men, men of renown."

Worry

Philippians 4:6 Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done.

Matthew 6:33 ...seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. 34 Therefore do not worry about tomorrow,

for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

Worry is an indication that we think God cannot look after us. Oswald Chambers (1874-1917)

Worry is like a rocking chair. It gives you something to do but doesn't get you anywhere. Bernard Meltzer

Worry never robs tomorrow of its sorrow, it only saps today of its strength. Archibald Joseph Cronin (1896-1981)

No man ever sank under the burden of the day. It is when tomorrow's burden is added to the burden of today that the weight is more than a man can bear. Never load yourself so. George Macdonald

Not work but worry makes us weary. S. I. McMillen

Worry is a thin stream of fear trickling through the mind. If encouraged, it cuts a channel into which all other thoughts are drained. Arthur Somers Roche

Fear – of failure, of rejection, of death

Max L. Lucado put it like this, "Fear. Satan's modus operandi is to manipulate you with the mysterious, to taunt you with the unknown. Fear of death, fear of failure, fear of God, fear of tomorrow-his arsenal is vast. His goal? To create cowardly, joyless souls. He doesn't want you to make the journey to the mountain. He figures if he can rattle you enough, you will take your eyes off the peaks and settle for a dull existence in the flatlands."

2 Timothy 1:7 For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline.

Hebrews 2:14, 15 "...that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, 15 and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.

Oswald Chambers said, "The remarkable thing about fearing God is that when you fear God, you fear nothing else, whereas if you do not fear God, you fear everything else. "

Remember the armor of God in Ephesians 6:10-18 so you can stand against the troops and tricks/lies of the evil one. Also, remember James 4:7's formula for victory:

1. Surrender yourself to God – I surrender All – Have you?
2. Resist the devil – Ephesians 6:10, 11
3. He will flee from you – Greater is the One in you, than the one in the world.
